Coach's Corner

Transition Q and A

As you are entering a period of transition, I wanted to take a moment to answer some questions you may be having about what's to come.

- **Q.** When is Aart leaving again?
- **A.** My last day will be June 30, which happens to be a Sunday.
- **Q.** Who will become the new pastor after he leaves?
- **A.** This will be a process in stages. 1) a mission study committee will prepare a study on Parkview's demographics, theology and mission going forward, which they will present to the congregation. 2) the Session will select from candidates to become interim minister. The Presbytery will provide names, but any Presbyterian Church USA pastor with interim training will be allowed to apply. 3) a pastor nomination committee will prepare an MIF (ministry information form) informed by the mission study, place it online, and start receiving pastoral information forms that match the church profile (i.e. Parkview's needs and wants matched with pastor skills and passions).
- **Q.** What is the timeline for each of these stages?
- **A.** This is tentative, but the mission study committee will probably work from late April through late August. By that time there should be an interim pastor. Then the Pastor nominating committee (PNC) will go to work, and they should have the Ministry profile online by November or so. After that it will take a year or more to narrow down the applicants and interview them.
- Q. Some denominations just appoint a new pastor. Why does it take so long at Parkview?
- **A.** The Presbyterian Church USA has a democratic system. It has been time tested for several centuries. It is actually good for a congregation to get some distance between itself and the former pastor, so that they will be fully ready for a fresh new approach and not long so much for the old ways.
- **Q.** Who will be on these committees?
- A. Pending session approval, the mission study committee will be made up of Richard Uno, Mieko Davis (PNC), Titus Toyama, Lois Van Beers, and Gary Younglove (Session). They were judiciously invited by session member May Lee. The PNC was approved during a special congregational meeting after careful scrutiny by the nominating committee (Janet Hill and Effie Komure-Hanway) with attention to age, gender, and ethnic diversity. The members approved were Mieko Davis (with Haruko Sakakibara as alternate), Gary Younglove, William Yee, Maurine Huang, Wade Tambara, and Herning Grissom.

- **Q.** Can only Presbyterian pastors apply to be pastor?
- **A.** No, pastors of other denominations can apply, but they will need to know, understand, and respect the Presbyterian system and values, and their denomination will need to have a cooperation agreement with our denomination.
- Q. How long will Rola and Veronica stay?
- **A.** According to their contracts, they only need to give one month's notice, but as it stands now, Rola will be at Parkview through the end of 2020, and Veronica's contract goes through August 2019, when she and Parkview will need to discuss her plans after that.
- **Q.** Will the interim pastor be working full time?
- **A.** This is up to the Session (with input from the congregation) to decide. You will have to take into account: 1) who is available to be an interim pastor, 2) financial considerations and planning, and 3) the tasks assigned to the residents.
- **Q.** What do you need from us?
- **A.** It is important that you share with your Session (William Yee, Pattie Hashimoto, May Lee, Carol Sakai, Gary Younglove, and Christine Umeda) what your thoughts are on the interim pastor! Probably by early May if not before they will start looking for an interim.
- **Q.** Will there be any staff changes during the transition period?
- **A.** Not that I know of. Office manager Kris Sazaki and choir director Ben Pryor will continue in their present capacities and with their present schedules.

May God bless your ministry. See you in church! Aart

Rola writes:

Life has changed tremendously for me since I answered my first call to ministry a little over a year ago. It's a new stage of my life, and I got to start it with you at Parkview. As the past year has unfolded, I have become more and more aware of the changes God is bringing into my life and beliefs; I have started to understand more deeply my calling and passions. Though I am nowhere close to being done with the discernment process, I know now for a fact that not only is this my place but that this is also my clear vocation. Therefore, I'm currently transitioning from being an inquirer with the Presbytery of Sacramento to becoming a candidate for ministry, which is a step closer to ordination.

And with the many recent changes: in my visa status, soon in my Presbytery relation status, in our church leadership, and with new tasks added to my responsibilities with the Vital Congregations team, I confess that there are times when I feel like I am losing connection with myself. However, whenever that happens, I allow myself to go back to my spiritual home and reconnect to my true self. And somehow, strangely, I feel like I've been part of this community forever. A strong sense of comfort and connection is found in the familiarity of this church family, even with its flaws and shortages. It's become an integral part of my story, one that is as significant as a well-loved childhood memory, one that brings ease and security despite the insecurities of the transitions both the church and I are undergoing.

The journey might not be easy for any of us, but may we remember to return to God every time we lose connection with ourselves as a community, for in God is our safety and our timeless spiritual home. Parkview, thank you for letting me walk this journey with you.

Sac State Students Visit Parkview

Students from Professor Robin Datel's Field Geography: Urban-Metropolitan class at CSUS visited Parkview on Feb 8. They spent over an hour with Aart, Rola, Veronica, and Kris. Many of these students are anticipating working as city planners, so Prof. Datel wanted them to "learn the depth of feelings people have for the histories of their families, communities, and the institutions that embody them." Prof. Datel later explained that the Parkview representatives did a lot "to educate [the students] about how a church can be such an institution."



The students had many fascinating questions, many of which revolved around Parkview's interactions with the surrounding community. We pointed to our work with Loaves and Fishes, WIND Services, and our December hosting of the Southside Park Neighborhood Association dinner.
