Coach's Corner

Principles of Good Governance

Dear Friends,

This past January I led a memorial service for my neighbor Ben Parker, a former sheep farmer on the Canterbury plains outside Christchurch, New Zealand. For a number of years, Ben was the president of the Northern California Rugby Federation until shortly before his tragic death at 49. He was highly intelligent and articulate, and he could outwit and outmaneuver anybody both as coach and as administrator. As a native of New Zealand, where rugby is a national religion, Ben was passionate about establishing good governance in a fledgling organization that is overflowing with testosterone. It was an almost impossible task. Right now in our nation and in democratic nations around the world the principles of good governance are being tested. Traditional ways of interpreting the separation of powers are in dispute. Wherever you look these days, governance seems to be a topic of contention.

What is good governance in a church like ours? This should concern us as you enter a time of transition and uncertainty. There may be times when you will ask, "Who is in charge, and how do we make decisions?" Therefore, I wanted to hold a few principles before you which will mostly be apparent to you already.

- 1. Love each other like a family, but don't govern yourselves as a family. Families tend to be run by tradition, by seniority, or by a decisive aunt or uncle everyone defers to. There is a Presbyterian system in place. If a decision is not clear or seems controversial, bring the issue to the Session. If the Session can't resolve it, they can bring it to the congregation. If the decisions made by those bodies are not workable, go back and repeat the process until the congregation gets it right.
- 2. No one or two individuals have veto power in the church. This includes the pastor. The pastor sets the tone and offers a direction the congregation should go in, but the pastor does not rule the congregation. Only the ordering of worship is the pastor's prerogative, the rest is subject to session decisions. I have seen many people come and go as session members over the years. I have seen them overrule my suggestions or even ignore them. I have also seen them act decisively. I have also seen them take risks with ideas I had, such as the
 - residency program. Session members cannot serve more than six years at a time, and they are selected by an independent nominating committee and voted on by the congregation.
- 3. You are the Church because you are followers of Jesus Christ, not because you have a pastor or a building. In our system, you technically only need on ordained pastor for baptism, communion, and moderating session/congregational meetings. You can challenge any pastor's (or other staff person's) leadership through the personnel committee.

- 4. Where the working of the church intersects with boundary issues in society, the congregation must develop implementable policies. These policies are constantly subject to review as your ministry, society, and your relationship to society change.
- 5. Trust the process and keep communicating with each other. Assume everyone in the congregation is well-intentioned even if their vision for the church is not the same as yours. Remember that if you follow the steps outlined above, you have an outsized chance of remaining a healthy church that can thrive even in challenging times.

Thank you for your commitment. May God bless your ministry. See you in church! Aart


Parkview is Looking Spiffy!



Thank you to all of our youth, their parents, and all of our




youth leaders and volunteers who remind me what a gift it is to be part of an intergenerational church! Thank you Parkview for your continued support of our youth!
