# **Coach's Corner**

## **Blessed disruption?**

Can disruption be a good thing? Interruptions almost never seem to be positive, and disruptions appear to be more serious. Yet today in the tech world the word disruption is pretty much synonymous with positive change. Our son Andrew was so excited to be invited to present an app at a tech conference called "Disrupt San Francisco" last year. The gathering is known as an "incubator" (another one of those words which don't have such a negative connotation anymore).

Ever since my announcement that I will leave June 30 (yes, next month already), I have been trying to reassure you about continuity; your leadership will still be in place. An interim pastor search committee is getting close to putting out a part-time job posting. The mission statement committee just met. They will be putting together the document about who Parkview is and what it wants to be and do in its community. As a congregation, you have already voted in the members of the "permanent" pastor nominating committee. They will be using that document as a blueprint. Rola and Veronica are planning to be here for the foreseeable future, possibly even until the end of next year when the residency program will end, and when you should be getting close to selecting a new pastor. Right now we have about \$47,000 of general money in our accounts, but after the new sound system goes in, and we pay monthly expenses, we may dip below our desired \$30,000 reserve cushion. Nevertheless, with the session deciding to seek a *part-time* interim pastor, Parkview will have a chance to build back its reserve to levels before the big repairs of the last years.

However, if we are honest, we have to admit that you are also experiencing disruption. Your role in the events of the coming years may not feel as predictable. You may fear that there may be changes in how often you see the people you enjoy seeing the most. There are extra tasks you may be asked to do that disrupt your regular activities. I know the pastoral residents are feeling the disruption as the person who will be supervising them is the great unknown right now. Frankly, I am also experiencing the disruption. I can have great plans for the contribution I want to make in retirement, but this is all dependent on the cooperation of other people, and their actions are not entirely predictable. Besides, I have developed quite a routine over the years.

On the other hand, disruption is not new. When I came as the first Parkview pastor of non-Asian ancestry, it was a disruption. When we went from one sermon to three brief ones, that was a disruption. The residency program was a real disruption for a number of you. There are many other things I could mention. I think that on balance disruption, when done with the wellbeing of all in mind (win-win) rather than to create winners or losers, is a good thing in an organization. The society around you is changing rapidly. Churches must change along with it. Ten years from a now a largely different crowd may be sitting in the Parkview pews along with you. They will be there because you will have adjusted to the disruption out there, which is constant. Friends, embrace the disruption. There's no dodging it. May God bless our ministry. Thank you for your commitment! See you in church! Aart

# Veronica writes:

In April I had the privilege of being invited to join the 50th anniversary pilgrimage to Manzanar, which is one of the sites where Japanese Americans were incarcerated during World War II. I want to begin by thanking everyone who invited me and encouraged me to go. For those of you who have not yet had a chance to go, I think it is an incredible opportunity, and I would be happy to share more about my experience when I see you in church!

I wanted to share a few reflections from my pilgrimage. First, I was struck by the power of intergenerational community. On our trip, we had eight former incarcerees who shared their stories with us. We also had two young children! A number of people had come as families. These stories and memories are passed through generations, and the impact can be powerful.

Second, I found myself thinking about remembering history as uncovering the truth. For some, that looked like finding out information about their families that hadn't previously been shared. For others, it meant connecting their family history to someone else's to find a clearer picture of this period of time. For me, it meant seeing for myself a great injustice that had been obscured by history textbooks. It was a reminder to question not only who tells a story but how the story gets told.

Finally, witnessing the leadership of JACL and CAIR

was a reminder that we each have a responsibility to one another. We remember so that we will reject exclusion and violence against anyone. Our multicultural, interfaith group of travelers was joined together in the common cause of justice for all. I pray that this will be reflected in all that we do as a church at Parkview!


# Kansha Gets Kitchen Makeover
