Coach's Corner

Being There

Dear Friends,

As I write my last Coach's Corner for Parkview, many of you are in the church service led by Rola and Veronica. I am not there with them, although there will be four more Sundays when I will be. In the film *Being There*, based on the novel by Jerzy Kosiński, Peter Sellers plays the role of a man named Chance, who has spent all of his professional life tending a garden near Washington D.C. He knows nothing about the world besides gardens and television. Once outside his small world, he makes simple statements which get interpreted as great words of wisdom, even by powerful people. What people really love about him is his presence and perceived depth.

When church is "done" well, people experience real presence and depth. Deep down we all crave the presence of people who are really interested in our wellbeing and a setting where the real questions of everyday life are brought into connection with the Eternal Presence. Parkview is such a place. We know the televised world we are part of is superficial and doesn't truly connect us. We cannot turn people on and off with a TV remote the way Chance tries to in the movie.

Of course, church like that only works if there is participation. Televised church does not ultimately satisfy because it is consumption religion. It is not interactive, engaged, or connected. There is an old question: "What is the church?" The sanitized version of the answer is: "It's what's left if both the pastor and the building were lost." So church is people who seek to gather with worship of God in mind. For that to happen, those people need to be there.

In about a month, my being there with and for you as your pastor will be over. It is time for new leadership and time for me to no longer lead a congregation. It is the reflection of the changeability of all things. There will be others to be present with you and talk to you about the things in life that ultimately matter. My request is that whoever comes after me as an interim or more permanently installed pastor will be welcomed fully in the way Carolyn and I and our boys were welcomed many years ago. I trust you will give her or him a chance to be the leader that she or he feels called to be. If the person you choose (and I have great faith in the wisdom of your Pastor Nominating Committee) were to be an awful lot like me, chances are it will not be the right one. Please remember that there are many templates for being a pastor.

The pastor, as Carolyn once wisely noted, sets the tone, but remember that the pastor is not supposed to carry the church, you are. So please help carry Parkview through this transition. Whenever you can, be there.

What is left for me is to thank you profusely for your patience, friendship, generosity, kindness, and cooperation over the years. May God bless your ministry. And see you in church this month.

Our residents' column on their recent activities.

Rola writes:

Friends, what holds you accountable? Is it your family? Your job? Your principles? Your partners? To me, it's my Faith. However, that wasn't always the case. There was a time when my faith was just a belief in a set of doctrines which did not interfere with any other aspect of my life. As I grew spiritually, I learned that a faith that is not functional is dead, whether it is individual or communal faith.

The Office of Vital Congregations, which I had the privilege to work with in the past year, has developed seven marks of congregational vitality, which churches can use to assess their own health and vitality and hold themselves accountable to their initial calling.

1. *Lifelong Discipleship Formation*. Is the church making differences in the lives of those sitting in the pews? Are people taking something they get on Sunday morning out with them to the world?

2. Intentional Authentic Evangelism. Do we cherish this Faith so much that we invite people to take part in it? 3. Outward Incarnational Focus. If our church doors closed today, would our neighbors notice any difference?

4. *Empowering Servant Leadership*. Do we identify, acknowledge, and create opportunities to use the skills of the many members of the church family?

5. *Spirit Inspired Worship*. Is the focus of Sunday morning worship pleasing to God and uplifting to the souls of those attending worship?

6. *Caring Relationships*. Is our church made of members who genuinely care about each other and who have a strong bond together beyond Sunday morning? (I think we would score the highest on this mark.)

7. *Ecclesial Health*. This mark is about transparency in handling our finances and in the way decisions are made and responsibilities are shared in the church.

I sincerely hope Parkview decides to join the Vital Congregations initiative. In any case, we can use these marks to evaluate ourselves as a church, especially as we go through transition and as we attempt to redefine who we are and who we want to be.

I would be willing to talk more in depth about Vital Congregations should there be any interest. You know where to find me.
