Session Notes

Our beloved Parkview Presbyterian Church is in need of repair and preventive maintenance. There are immediate repairs that are urgent and other repairs that need to be prioritized for completion. Discussion regarding funding for these repairs has been on-going at Session meetings. Session is sharing this information with the congregation to inform you of the needed repairs. If there are additional repairs you wish to discuss, please communicate this to Session members.

Repairs that require immediate attention:

• The roof above the church office and around the bell tower is leaking and in poor condition. Roof analysis reports concur that the composition shingles are deteriorated and the drain and gutters need to be cleaned and replaced. Due to the many years of previous repairs and roof coating, the exact source and cause of the roof leakage has not been determined. The roofers have recommended "band aid" short term repairs that need to be performed before the rains start. The long-term permanent fix and the financial costs will be assessed after the initial repairs are made, and the roof is water tested. The roof will need ongoing yearly preventive maintenance including inspections, repairs, replacement, and removal of debris. Currently there have been five estimates for the repairs.

Other identified repairs and improvements:

- The large kitchen refrigerator temperature control is not working and is slated to be repaired soon. The food had to be tossed out on 8/27/19.
- There is a broken fence near the garbage can area.
- Gutters and drainpipes need to be cleaned and a drain pipe in rear of church has to be put back on.
- The front door molding on the lock side is not stable and the door needs weather stripping.
- The garage needs to be renovated and sealed to allow for better, cleaner storage of cooking and other equipment.
- Sprinkler head maintenance is needed.
- Advanced raccoon control is needed to prevent continued deposits on the lawn.
- Car park lines behind the church need to be repainted.
- The Kansha kitchen and entrance floors need repair or possible replacement. The linoleum is worn down. The linoleum in the kitchen has a seam coming up and is currently being held down by duct tape.
- A window frame in the office is rotted and needs replacement.

Recently completed repairs:

 Plumbing backed up in the kansha. A large root and root ball were discovered in the line and cleaned out. The float for the sewer line pump was replaced.
PG & E installed a new cleanout between the kansha and the heiwa as part of its neighborhood improvements at no cost to Parkview.

- The capacitor on the older air conditioning unit needed to be replaced.
- The sound mixer broke but was successfully replaced with the new sound mixer that is part of the new sound system.
- The broken stage curtain track has been repaired (repair cost gifted by Titus and Donna Toyama).

Update on Electrical and Public Address (PA) System:

The much awaited PA system is coming soon. Parkview's electrical system is being upgraded to conform to code and to handle the upcoming new PA system. This is a very generous financial donation made by Wade and Tom Tambara to cover the costs of the upgraded electrical system and replacement of the electrical panel. In addition to the donation of funds for the electrical system upgrade, the Tambara family has graciously donated the funds from the George and Toshi Tambara memorials to purchase the new PA system for the church. The PA equipment has now been purchased. The next step is the installation and hookup to the electrical system. The PA system is incredibly expensive due to the quality and cost of the system, electrical hookup, labor, and installation. We do want a lasting quality system. Parkview will be responsible for the PA system costs that exceed the Tambara family memorial funds. Parkview will need to discuss how to cover the costs of a security system to protect this equipment.

We hope this information has been helpful. Session and the congregation will continue this discussion, and updates will be provided. We invite you to share your thoughts with Session members regarding this or any subject of interest to you.

New Alcohol Policy

At their August 11, 2019 meeting, the Session voted to rescind the previous alcohol policy of April 2018 and replace it with the new policy as written below:

1. The PPC alcohol policy shall apply to all events held on the premises.

2. Alcoholic beverages may not be offered for sale or sold on the premises of PPC.

3. PPC may not serve alcoholic beverages at any fundraising events without the expressed approval of Session.

4. Any alcoholic beverage stored at PPC must be stored in a secure place and out of reach of persons under 21 years of age.

5. PPC does not promote the use of alcohol and does not assume any responsibility for the consumption of alcohol by persons supplying their own source of alcohol.

6. Under no circumstance at PPC may a person under the age of twenty-one (21) be allowed to consume alcohol, even when accompanied by their parent.
