Residency Program Update By Irene Uno

While we all miss Pastor Aart, Parkview Presbyterian Church is so fortunate to have two pastoral residents, Rola Al Ashkar and Veronica Gould, to help minister to the congregation and run the church while we search for an interim pastor. You may be wondering about the impact of Pastor Aart's retirement on the role of Rola and Veronica in our church and how their duties and responsibilities have changed. On behalf of the Advisory Committee, including Lois

Van Beers and Maurine Huang, I write this article hoping it provides you with some insight into our residents, post-Aart's retirement. The Advisory Committee provides support and advice to the pastoral residents on matters involving their roles and responsibilities to the church. The Committee does not supervise the residents but provides them with constructive feedback in the hope of fostering positive relationships between them and the congregation.

One of the most important responsibilities of the pastoral residents is to lead us in a meaningful service each Sunday. They are responsible for making the lesson come to life and be relevant to the needs of our specific congregation. Pastor Aart knew all of us for so long but now our residents no longer have his guidance. Preparing the sermon is not easy as it requires the residents to be in tune with what members of the congregation may be experiencing collectively and perhaps individually as well. For instance, it goes without saying that we have experienced a sense of loss with Pastor Aart's retirement and the recent passing of two beloved members of our congregation. Preparing the lessons and sermons against this backdrop takes time and sensitivity. Both residents have had to take a larger role in preaching each Sunday and they have had to make pastoral decisions such as selecting guest ministers to officiate communion.

After the passing of church members Effie Komure-Hanway and Tee Kinoshita, Rola stepped up to officiate at their respective memorial services. The amount of time, effort, and energy it took for Rola to speak sincerely and from the heart in order to provide comfort to the family and friends of these church members cannot be overstated. Both Rola and Veronica have

taken on other responsibilities in Pastor Aart's absence. They provide pastoral care and counseling upon request and reach out to church members and families who express a need. In addition, along with our ever efficient office manager, Kris Sazaki, they have become more involved in the day to day decision making related to the upkeep of our aging church and its grounds.

One of the near term goals for both Rola and Veronica is to provide adult, Christian education to those in our congregation who are interested. They plan to survey the congregation shortly in order to determine interest and to develop a lesson plan. Not forgetting our youth, Veronica is working on a new Sunday school curriculum. Keep in mind that in addition to the above, both Rola and Veronica continue to be engaged in community outreach. Rola has taught English as a Second Language and on a more national scale, she has taken a genuine interest in being involved with the



Presbyterian Church of the USA. To this end, she is a member of the writing and pastor liaison teams for the Vital Congregations Initiative. Rola also participates in an effort by mainline Protestant denominations in Sacramento to reach out to Middle Eastern refugees.

Veronica remains busy with community outreach as well. Veronica recently completed a summer Chaplaincy Program at the UCD Medical Center. She gives back to that program by volunteering to mentor new students who may be struggling with the heart wrenching tasks of ministering to patients and their families in a hospital setting. Veronica also continues to volunteer at William Land school and St. John's pantry and the food justice and homeless outreach program.

The personal and professional goal for both Rola and Veronica is ordination—Rola in the Presbyterian Church and Veronica in the Lutheran Church. They continue to work toward their ordination goal while ministering to us at Parkview. The requirements for ordination in both churches are varied and rigorous, ranging from substantive exams (Presbyterian) and interviews and screenings (Lutheran). Besides their responsibilities at Parkview, these young women miss and keep in close contact with their families, who live far away. We appreciate the sacrifices they have made to join us for this short while. We are happy to have our pastoral residents guide us during this transition phase while we search for an Interim Pastor.

Parkview is fueled by its volunteers, many of whom work behind the scenes to keep the church going.



Tsuru for Solidarity Informational Meeting


