Officer Vacancies

Election for officers will be held in January. You may be the perfect person to serve as an officer at Parkview. Below are the *current vacancies* with requirements and duties. If you are not a member but feel called to serve on a committee that requires membership, consider your call to join the congregation as a member. If you are a member and feel called to serve in a role that requires you to be a ruling elder, maybe God is calling you to get ordained and serve your congregation. Please talk to any of the Pastoral Residents; we are here to help you and walk alongside you as you discern what God is calling you to do. We will be happy to provide you with any additional information you may need.

SESSION: *Two vacancies* (3-year term)

What is the Session? The session is the council for the congregation. It is composed of ordained elders, also called ruling elders, together with all installed pastors and associate pastors. Parkview's Session meets bimonthly on the second Sunday of the month but may meet at other times such as for a Session retreat.

What does the Session do? "The session shall have responsibility for governing the congregation and guiding its witness to the sovereign activity of God in the world, so that the congregation is and becomes a community of faith, hope, love, and witness." Specific duties include: election of church treasurer and clerk of session, approval of budget, financial review, review of membership rolls, authorizing money for maintaining the church building or activities and events of the congregation, looking into legal matters, appointing interim pastors, calling a congregational meeting, approving baptisms, memorials and new joining members, adding or removing members, commissioning committees for a specific role (e.g. Interim Pastor Search Committee).

Who can serve on session? Session members have to be official members and ruling elders of the congregation.

COMMISSIONER TO THE PRESBYTERY: One vacancy (no term limits)

Who are the commissioners to the Presbytery? Ruling elders (ordained elders) are elected by Session and attend the Presbytery's quarterly and other meetings called by the Presbytery. Commissioners submit a report to session, to keep the congregation informed on the Presbytery's and its member churches' news, changes, or events. Serving as a commissioner is a great way to connect with other Presbyterians and to learn how other congregations are serving as witnesses to God's kingdom!

CONGREGATIONAL NOMINATING COMMITTEE:

One vacancy from Session (2-year term)

What are the duties of the Nominating Committee? The congregational nominating committee can nominate ruling elders and deacons. It consists of at least three active members of the congregation and shall include at least one ruling elder who is currently serving on the Session. It is elected by the congregation and drawn from and representative of its membership. Any official member of the church can serve on the nominating committee, provided that one of its members is an elder presently serving on session.

Our residents' column on their recent activities.

Rola writes:

It is hard to believe the end of December will mark the end of my second year at Parkview! It's been quite a journey. In my first year I had so much to learn: the history culture of this country and the different ethnic and religious groups; Parkview's own unique culture and Japanese-American the

experience; and the Presbytery of Sacramento, many of whose member churches I visited.

In this second year, I had been focusing on my ordination process. I am happy to tell you that I am in the last step of the ordination process, and I would like to give you an idea of what it entails. A person seeking ordination with the PCUSA has to be a member of a PCUSA church, who had completed their Master of Divinity or an equivalent degree in an accredited seminary. Then they should submit a request to the Committee on Preparation for Ministry (CPM) to become an inquirer.

The inquirer has to serve a church for at least a year before submitting an application for candidacy along with a Statement of Call to the CPM. The inquirer's supervisor, Pastor Aart in my case, also submits a report with their feedback on the inquirer's work and eligibility for ministry. After the inquirer answers any questions the CPM may have. The committee then votes on moving the inquirer to candidacy.

The Presbytery votes at the presbytery meeting to accept the inquirer as a candidate for ordination. That happened for me on May 17th when Parkview hosted the Presbytery meeting. That was special!

The candidate has to complete four Senior Ordination exams, a Bible Content exam, and a psychological evaluation, all while continuing to serve in ministry for at least another year. After the candidate passes the exams, completes the psychological evaluation, and fulfills the required time in ministry, the candidate for ministry is ready to receive a call and then ordained to that call.

I am almost there. I started my examinations last January, but after receiving the news of Pastor Aart's retirement plans, the focus shifted back to my new role at Parkview. Today, I am in the last stages of this lengthy process. I have finished two tests in October and am signed up for the last two this coming January. Your graciousness and support throughout this journey have made it an enjoyable one for me. Thank you Parkview for giving me the opportunity to serve you while working towards achieving my goals. May God bless our ministry.
