Parkview's Residency Program

Dear Parkview Member,

The pastoral residency agreements between Parkview Presbyterian Church and Rola Al Ashkar and Veronica Gould, will be ending on December 31, 2020. Two congregational meetings will be held immediately after church service via Zoom (https://us02web.zoom.us/j/81126843765) on September 13 and September 20 to discuss a six-month extension of the residency agreement with Veronica Gould for the period January 1, 2021 to June 30, 2021. Following the congregational meetings, you will be asked to vote on whether you are in favor of or oppose the six-month extension for Veronica. The extension proposal does not include Rola since she will be seeking a new call when her term expires in December. For the past 4 years, the residency program has been funded almost entirely by the Presbytery of Sacramento (recently re-organized and named the "North Central California (NCC) Presbytery"). The remaining funds for the residency program came from an agreement between the Presbytery and Parkview so that Parkview's yearly contribution to the Presbytery's mission fund would be used to support the residency program. We anticipate that the 6-month extension will be funded in a similar way. Following the September 13 congregational meeting, a ballot will be mailed to each member of Parkview Presbyterian Church. Your ballot must be mailed to Parkview and postmarked by October 1, 2020. Here are the proposed expenses and funding for the 6-month extension:

Stand Up and Be Counted!

The deadline for the 2020 Census has been moved up to September 30! This is the last day to fill out the mandatory government survey that takes place once



every ten years. The information gathered will influence the distribution of federal funds for the next ten years as well as congressional representation. In 2015 alone, California received \$77b in federal funding tied to the Census. Emergency services, transportation, education, Medi-Cal, Medicare, Meals on Wheels, and CalFresh are only a few of California's essential services that receive census-based funding. The Census can be completed by mail, by phone (1-844-330-2020) or online (www.census.gov). An enumerator may come to your place of residence to assist you, if you have not filled out your form. Look for their ID badge and the official Census logo to ensure that they are a legitimate Census employee. For every person who completes the Census, California becomes a better place to live. Shape your future by getting counted today.

Has anyone been feeling a little aimless this year? It can be hard to make plans in the midst of a transition of pastoral leadership and a global pandemic. Many of the things we thought were essential a year ago are hardly a part of our lives now, and other things have

emerged that we can't imagine living without. I am so proud of Parkview for adapting to change. Even when things have felt aimless in my own life, joining in the life of the church has reminded me that some essentials never change.

We are people of faith, dignity, and perseverance. We are children of the One God learning to love one another as brothers, sisters, and siblings. All that we do flows from the love that God has first given us. The Christian mission can be summarized by the greatest commandments, spoken by Jesus: love God and love one another. All that we do at Parkview ultimately comes back to this mission. Earlier in the year, I was entrusted with the creation of a mission survey to assess Parkview's goals and mission values. We received thirty responses, and while this isn't necessarily representative of the whole congregation, it does give an impression of where we are.

The first question highlighted the scope of our congregation's ministries. Our congregation's greatest missional priorities were worship and music, Christian education, and multicultural ministry. The second question pertained to Parkview's missional engagement with our neighborhood community in the Southside Park neighborhood of Sacramento. Our congregation's greatest missional priorities in our neighborhood outreach were addressing racism, which we are uniquely poised to do as a multicultural

congregation; spiritual support; and relieving hunger. A new food fund has been established with this third goal in mind.

As the Mission Study Committee and Pastor Nominating Committee carry out their missions, we are all discerning our common mission as a church. This has been a season of challenge and change, but also a season of greater clarity. May God continue to bless the mission of Parkview!



Terry Nishizaki Obituary

Terry Nishizaki was a longtime pharmacist at UC Davis Medical Center. Nishizaki served as the assistant director of Inpatient Pharmacy Services for more than 20 years. From his department's standpoint, Nishizaki could do it all. He



was a sterile compounding expert. He was the hospital's pharmacist-in-charge. He chaired the Nursing Pharmacy Medication Safety Committee. And he was a master at finding new sources for medications, no matter how severe the shortage.

Former colleagues say Nishizaki was a true "go-to" person for any help they needed. "Terry was a talented, thoughtful and compassionate leader whose priority was always to do what's best for the patient," said John Grubbs, who was a Pharmacy director during Nishizaki's years at the hospital. "He knew everyone in the hospital, and they all had the utmost respect for him. Whenever I needed something done, I knew I could depend on Terry to do it right."

Despite his busy work schedule, Nishizaki was devoted to family. He was very involved with his daughters' extracurricular activities. He also enjoyed playing golf, attending basketball games, leading raffles at his church's events, and spending time with his family, especially their big Wednesday night meals.

Nishizaki is survived by wife Cathy, daughters Jennifer and Leah, and a grandchild, Emi.
