Coming Full Circle

On September 29, 2020, I celebrated my 29th anniversary of ordination as a PC(USA) Minister of the Word and Sacrament. I can hardly believe that I have been ordained for 29 years! As a friend wrote on my Facebook page, "This is the date that you were ordained, but you were in ministry even much longer than this date." And he is absolutely right. I think I am someone who has always had "The Call." A childhood friend reminded me once that as kids I made them play "Church" with me. I would give my few friends a "hymnal" and then collect the "offering." I seem to recall that I also said a little prayer. What's interesting is that when I got older, I didn't see "The Call" in me. Everyone else could see it, but I could not. After I graduated from Sacramento State University, I wasn't sure what I was going to do next, but suddenly so many people came out of the woodwork telling me I should go to seminary. I was stunned. I remember telling my parents that I was thinking about going to seminary, and my mom said to me, "I always knew you were going to go to seminary." I wanted to say to her, "If you knew, then why didn't you tell me earlier?" I had no idea that other people saw this potential in me when I didn't. So I listened to my community. I applied to seminary, and I was accepted.


I went through my first semester of school, and I thought to myself, "What am I doing here? I don't belong." It was so tough. But then the second semester came along and instead of all of the academic work, I was also put into a church setting. I was assigned to work with Rev. Norman Fong in San Francisco's Cameron House in Chinatown. It was when I was put in a church setting that suddenly . . . I felt called. It finally clicked. It felt right. Most people have The Call and then go to seminary. I went to seminary and then had The Call. What's interesting is that I felt at home in an Asian American ministry setting. It's interesting to see 29 years later how life has come full circle, and I am doing ministry, once again, in an Asian American setting and feel at home. It's one of the reasons I am so proud to be supervising the residency program. I know intimately the value of the in-church experience before ordination, and I am so proud of Parkview for having a residency program as part of its ministy.

During these past 29 years, I have had my ups and downs in ministry. To be sure, there are definitely moments when I have contemplated leaving church ministry to serve in a different capacity. Yet, I have stayed in the ring. I am still in ministry. I am still Called. Why? Because I have been bitten by the "Jesus Bug." If there was anything else in the world that I could do, I would do it in a heartbeat, but I truly cannot. I have stayed in ministry all these years because of my love for Jesus, his ministry, his inspiring work, and love to transform the world anew. I am compelled to continue telling the Good News of Jesus' transformative way of being and how we, too, can live into hope. As the old hymn says:

I love to tell the story

Twill be my theme in glory To tell the old, old story Of Jesus and his love

I have officially been telling this story for 29 years...whew! I can hardly believe it! Let's keep it going for another 29 years!



Our residents' column on their recent activities.

Rola writes:

As you read this, less than three months separate me from the end of my journey at Parkview! It has been a rich journey, in which I not only learned about intercultural ministry, but I also got the chance to be involved with mid-councils and the National office. I would like to give you an overview of my current ministry outside Parkview.



I am currently involved with four different national offices. The first is the office of Vital Congregations, which is an initiative to revitalize the PCUSA churches. I joined the team over two years ago. I helped write resources for the initiative, envisioned parts of it, and am currently one of their coaches, in charge of five presbyteries that I connect with on a monthly basis to check their progress and provide help, if needed. Secondly, some of you will remember Samuel Son, who visited Parkview back in November. He is the moderator of an intercultural leaders gathering that I am part of. We usually meet once a month via Zoom, but during the summer we met more frequently to plan and prepare for the Intercultural Transformation national gathering that just ended on Sept 26 and which some of you attended.

As I wrote to you before, I am an apprentice with the office of 1001 New Worshipping Communities. This office coaches and supports individuals who want to start new church plants. As I get ready to start my yoga-based New Worshipping Community that will be nested at Westminster Presbyterian Church, I continue to attend weekly meetings with cohorts walking through similar journeys as well as monthly meetings with my coach.

I am also serving on the board of the Presbyterian Mission Agency (PMA) which is the big umbrella under which all of the above offices operate. The PMA board sets the policies and advises the General Assembly on programs and strategies for the ministries of the Presbyterian Church. As a member of the PMAB, I also serve on two national committees also in charge of setting policies and mission work plans and budgets for the various ministries of the PMA. At the local level, you all know by now that the Presbytery of Sacramento and the Presbytery of Stockton are coming together to form the Presbytery of North Central California. Since summer, I have been on a planning and envisioning team along with other members of the two presbyteries; this team is looking into setting policies and procedures, plans and visions for our newly formed presbytery. And finally, I recently joined the Syria and Lebanon Partnership Network (SLPN). This network partners with my former Presbyterian church in Lebanon and Syria and supports its ministry. I am serving as Vice Moderator of the Steering Committee of the SLPN. This is all exciting work, and I am grateful for having this wonderful opportunity to serve in multiple capacities and appreciate your and the pastoral team's continuous support.
