Interim Pastor Training

It is a new year! Thank goodness 2021 has arrived! As each day passes, it means that it gets us one step closer to getting back to normal and being able to be in one another's presence once again. 2021 also means that this will be the year that you will get your permanent pastor as well. The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) is working hard to get everything in order for the search to begin. In the meantime, I was asked to give a report on my recent interim training and what I had learned. So I would like to share that with you now.

I began my interim training work in 2001. It had been such a long time since I had done the original training that I recently embarked on taking Interim Training Week 1 and Week 2, once again, to get a refresher. The first thing I learned is that the term "interim pastor" is being replaced with "transitional pastor." I've also learned about where Parkivew is in its process of calling a new permanent pastor:

- Parkview is on target with its proceedings to search for a permanent pastor with your PNC.
- The Mission Study is complete and ready to attach to the Ministry Information Form which the PNC is in the process of writing.
- The interim pastor's main duty is to help put structures and processes into place to help the new, incoming permanent pastor. These structures and processes include committees, supervising staff, and Book of Order procedures.

According to the Office of the General Assembly, here are some duties a congregation can expect from an interim pastor:

Like all pastors, Interim/Transitional Pastors offer the congregations they serve:

- Worship leadership and preaching
- Pastoral care
- • Work with the session to provide for the life and ministry of the congregation.
- Administrative work, including supervision of other staff persons.
- Staff support for programs and committees of the congregation.

In addition, an Interim/Transitional Pastor leads a congregation during the transition time after an installed pastor has departed, helping the congregation prepare to welcome the leadership of a new installed pastor. Interim/Transitional Pastors understand the dynamics of a congregation in transition, including feelings of grief, loss, and, sometimes, relief or anger. Interim/Transitional pastors will help the session provide for continuity of essential programs, and may assist the session in assessing needs for changes in programs and ministries of the congregation.

I also learned from this training that *all* churches and *all* pastors are in transitional ministry, especially during this time of Covid. This pandemic has dramatically altered the way all of us will do church. Moving forward, hybrid online and in-person worship services will, most likely, be the norm once the lockdowns lift.

Thoughts on Prayer

I was fortunate enough to be raised in a Christian home where we attended church and prayed - at least at dinner time and



before bed. Sometimes, the prayers were memorized and recited (you might know, "Now I lay me down to sleep..."), but often, we did a "Talk-to-God" prayer, which was not scripted and was more of a conversation about our day or something we were thankful for. As I went through youth group and became an adult, I participated in lots of small groups where sharing our concerns and celebrations was a critical part of connecting with others, and I got more comfortable with praying aloud with other people. I think prayer is an essential part of connecting ourselves with God.

WHY should we pray? The Bible tells us that God loves us and wants to be in a relationship with us – THAT is why he sent Jesus and why we celebrate Christmas! Well, just like any other relationship, the parties have to spend time together getting to know each other and sharing their experiences. God wants us to spend time with Him and one of the ways we do that is to pray. It may feel like you're having a onesided conversation at first, but with practice, and with spending time in the Bible and learning to listen for God's voice in your life, it can become a wonderful time of closeness with our creator and savior.

But HOW do I pray? To me, prayer is as simple as a conversation with God. Think about anyone else you want to have a close personal relationship with, and how you'd want to be able to talk with them. God is no different! Even though He is all-knowing, he still wants us to share the things we're worried about, the things we're hoping for, the questions we have and so much more. 
