The Lenten Season

Dear Parkview friends,

This Tuesday, Feb 16, the world will be celebrating Mardi Gras! Mardi Gras is also known as Fat Tuesday. In French Mardi means Tuesday, and Gras means Fat. In the Christian calendar, Mardi Gras takes place on the Tuesday before Ash Wednesday, which marks the beginning of Lent for 40 days. On Fat Tuesday, one is to sop up all of that fat in their homes because during the season of Lent, it reminds us of the time that Jesus wandered in the desert for forty days without any food. Traditionally the food during the season of Lent leading up to Easter is one that is simple and without oil. Therefore, Fat Tuesday means to eat up all the fat that you can because you aren't going to have some for the next six weeks! It's tradition to eat pancakes on Fat Tuesday because pancakes sop up a lot of oil. So since we can't be with each other face to face, for this Tuesday's Bible study on February 16 at 6:30 pm, we are asking everyone to wear your beads, Mardi Gras colors of green, purple and gold, and make some pancakes! It will be a time of fun, celebration, and listening to jazz.

The next night, Ash Wednesday, Feb 17, we will hold a Zoom worship at 6:00 pm. The Zoom meeting ID is *https://us02web.zoom.us/j/83328252469*. It will have a very different tone. This service will be quieter, more solemn, and introspective. We will listen to the scriptures, reflect on Jesus' wilderness experience, and remember that we are dust and to dust we shall return.

For the following six weeks in the Bible studies and the Sunday services, our Lenten theme will be "Out of Our Hearts and Into the World." We will take portions of the Mission Study that a group of participants in the Parkview community worked so hard to formulate. This is the document that will accompany the Ministry Information Form that the Pastor Nominating Committee is in the process of finalizing. This information will go to the national headquarters for the Presbyterian Church (USA) in Louisville, Kentucky and will be dispensed to clergy throughout the entire country. As Parkview prepares to hire a permanent pastor, the Worship Committee thought there would be wisdom in drawing upon the Mission Study, to delve into it as a community and to look into our hearts as people of faith, to look into what has come out of the heart of this mission study, and then to practically implement how we can

be people of faith out into the world especially as the world opens up again. So come . . . be a part of the party, the reflection, and a part of the community conversation.

Thoughts on Prayer

This is Part II of Sue Lorens' article on praying. Part I appeared in the January edition of the Chapel Chimes.

Today I'll share just a few of my favorite ways to pray.



- In the car. I turn off the radio and just talk out loud to God as if He was riding in the passenger seat! I always arrive at my destination feeling much more "centered" and ready to face things having turned over my worries and burdens
- to God. Or, I'm uplifted because I've been praising Him for the glory of a sunrise or something else that I notice along the way.*Songs.* I listen to Christian radio a lot. Often times,
- Songs. I listen to Christian radio a lot. Often times, there are songs that are prayers for me – the words say something that's on my heart so well, that I lift them up as a prayer. Sometimes, I sing along (especially when I'm alone in the car!), other times, I'll say, "God, this song is what's on my heart today."
- *Bible verses.* Frequently, I'll say things like, "Okay, God, the Bible tells me to give thanks in EVERY situation. I'm not feeling thankful exactly, but I'm going to obey. Please help me with this." Some people like to read the Psalms as a prayer.
- *Silently.* To me, prayers don't have to be out loud. I believe that God knows what we're thinking. I'm a school teacher at a non-religious school, but I can assure you that I'm sometimes thinking a prayer like, "Lord, please help me have patience with this child right now!"
- *Written prayers*. I write down prayers sometimes. This is a wonderful record that I can look back on over time to see how God has answered.

This is by no means a complete list. There are many ways to pray. If you are already someone who prays, I wonder if you can "stretch those prayer muscles" to pray more frequently, or to learn a new style of prayer. If you haven't tried praying before, I urge you to try one prayer each day – it can be as simple as, "Thank you, God for ______ today. Amen." I think the most important thing to remember is that we worship a God who loved us so much that He was willing to sacrifice His own son to restore our relationship with Him. He WANTS to spend time with us and there is no wrong way to do that. I'll be praying for YOU and with you this month!


Kansha Korner

Our pastoral resident's column on her recent activities.

Some of you know that I have been working on updating the church register. In addition to keeping it accurate and up-to-date, I am hoping to establish practices to keep it regularly in use in the life of the church. This way, the register will continue to serve as a powerful record of our congregation's history and legacy.

The church register is a physical book that has been in use since the 1920s. The book holds the record of memberships, baptisms, births, marriages, deaths, and memorials in Parkview's history. It also contains the record of service for elders, deacons, and pastors. I am amazed by this historic document! When I recently surveyed the church register, I discovered that two of our church members who passed away last year, Kiyoshi Fujiwara and Yukiko Ebisu, were both listed on the first page of the "communicant roll." This means that they were both a part of the beloved community that originally gathered and continues to gather to worship and serve the Lord here in Sacramento.

In this book, we can celebrate our past and look to



the future. Each blank space represents people who will be born, received in faith, or baptized into the community of believers. These blank spaces also remind us that some among us today will take on new responsibilities of leadership.

I am so grateful to have been entrusted with the task of ensuring the church register will continue to connect our past with our future. This is a project I have been working on for over a year, and I hope that it will be one of the legacies I will be able to offer to Parkview in my three years of service in ministry.
