Parkview Community Outreach

The disruption and damage of the past year have inspired many at Parkview with tremendous gratitude for ample incomes, safe homes, health, loved ones, and our church family. Gratitude has deepened compassion for those struggling to feed families or who are feeling unsafe within their own homes while sheltering in place. We've responded with donations to four community charities:

- South Sacramento Interfaith Partnership (SSIP) is a non-profit partnership of 13 faith communities that operates the 2nd largest food closet in Sacramento County. In 2020, 105,324 individuals were fed, representing 27,010 households in our community. That is 135% more people than it helped feed in 2019. Read more: https://www.ssipfoodcloset.org/.
- Wind Youth Services lends a hand to youth on the streets, ages 12-24. Staff was added due to increased hours at the 2 shelters since the youths are sheltering in place with on-line learning. The emergency dropin center at 8th and S operates 7 days a week. Wind is feeding about 50 young people a day. Read more: https://www.windyouth.org/
- My Sister's House reported a 17% uptick in calls during March of 2020. The shelter is full, the cafe closed to the public other than pick-up. Latest stats: 6706 stay nights in emergency shelters/transitional housing/hotels, 131 case management services for women and children, 445 women to work program, 417 restraining order assists, 20 human trafficking victims helped. - Iu-Mien Community Services usually celebrates the Lunar New Year; it is the biggest celebration of the year. This year they have had to forego it because of COVID, so the agency prepared special gift boxes for their elderly clients and their families instead. Read more: https://www.unitediumien.org/.


