Thoughts on Prayer

Love -- isn't that what our Christian faith is all about? Love is at the heart of everything that really matters. Jesus called love the greatest commandment: love God and love others. Jesus also gave his disciples the



command to love one another as he had loved them. In prayer, I find a powerful reminder and source of love. After all, prayer is communion with God, and God is love (1 John 4:16). Many people describe prayer as a spiritual practice, but have you ever thought of prayer as a practice of love?

God's love is the best starting point for prayer. I like to visualize being in the presence of God, accepted, held, wrapped in Divine love. For a long time, I have struggled with feelings of unworthiness. I didn't want to pray, because I felt guilty (often about not praying enough!). I've heard that how we pray can tell us a lot about what we believe. Having faith that God really loves me can be difficult. My belief in God's love for me is sometimes at odds with my own self-doubt and fear of rejection. But the scriptures testify to a loving God, who longs to be close to us. The good news for me is that God chooses to be loving, over and over, not because of who we are but because of who God is. So whatever I'm feeling, whatever state I'm in, the starting point for prayer is God's lavish and unconditional love.

And love is an infinite resource. Touched by Divine love in prayer, I find myself more open to give love. This can be in the form of gratitude to God for the many gifts of life that are easy to take for granted. It may be in the softening of my own heart, as I let go of old resentments and allow healing to take place. Or perhaps the Holy Spirit puts someone in particular on my heart, and I can pray for them in mind, body, and spirit. Praying for others is itself an act of love. It inspires compassion and empathy.

When we pray together as a community, we are joined together in love. This can look like our time of

sharing joys and concerns in worship, a gathering of the prayer team, or any two or more friends joining in prayer. Prayer gives us an opportunity to practice the most essential aspect of our faith: love. When we share prayer requests, we allow ourselves to be vulnerable. We allow ourselves to be loved, even by those who may not know us well. But this is the kind of love we are called to-- radical, inclusive love. This is the kind of love that allows us to pray for complete strangers and dearest friends. It even empowers us to pray for our enemies and those who would wish us harm. I believe this is the kind of love that can transform the world.

So I invite you to take up this precious practice of love. Allow yourself to be loved by God every day. Open yourself to Divine love in prayer. Pray for the ones you love and the ones you struggle to love. Pray for the people who have asked for prayer, and the people you don't even know. Let love be infinite! Don't be afraid to practice. In prayer, God will build us up in love. Amen.

Our pastoral resident's column on her recent activities.

Dear Parkview,

It has been two years and nine months since I first stepped foot in Sacramento, a place I have come to call home. In that time, we have experienced many transitions together, from changes in leadership to the COVID-19 pandemic. I have learned the importance of being adaptive, open, and creative. Most of my learning I have done by doing (or "building the plane while flying it"), including making my fair share of mistakes, and trying my best to learn and grow from them. It was at Parkview that I first preached without a manuscript, made pastoral care visits in the hospital and home, and helped to plan community events. I also had the chance to earn a unit of clinical pastoral education from UC Davis Health in the summer of 2019, and I earned my Certificate in Advanced Theological Studies from Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary 2020-2021.

I have been so richly blessed to have been welcomed by Parkview. You gave me a home, gave me a voice, and gave me a chance. I owe many thanks-- to my supervisors, Rev. Dr. Aart van Beek and Rev. I am also grateful to the communities of GKI Sacramento, St. John's Lutheran Church, Sacramento Presbytery, Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, Zephyr Point, JACL, CAIR, William Land Elementary School, Loaves and Fishes, UC Davis Health, and Sac ACT. Thanks to all of your support, I have been endorsed for candidacy in the ELCA by the Sierra Pacific Synod. The final stage of my candidacy will be an internship with Gloria Dei Lutheran Church in Dana Point, CA, beginning in August. I know that wherever my journey

in ministry will take me, I have been forever changed by Parkview. You have challenged and encouraged me. Your commitment to growing into God's call to intercultural ministry has been humbling and inspiring. It has been an honor to serve in ministry with you all. May God continue to bless the ministry of Parkview!
