Advent Candle Lighting

Today is the first Sunday in the season of Advent. Advent means "coming," and in this season we prepare for the coming of Christ. As the days grow shorter and the nights longer, we who are people of faith turn to symbols such as candles, evergreens and wreaths to proclaim our belief in the unquenchable light of God shining in Jesus.

This morning we light the first candle in the Advent wreath, the candle of Hope. (*Light the first candle nom*.) Hope is like light shining in a dark place. With the lighting of this candle, we celebrate the hope that we have in Jesus Christ as we pray for a world of love and peace. In the fifteenth year of the rule of Caesar Tiberius—it was while Pontius Pilate was governor of Judea; and Herod, ruler of Galilee; John, Zachariah's son, out in the desert at the time, received a message from God. He went all through the country around the Jordan River preaching a baptism of life-change leading to forgiveness of sins, as described in the words of Isaiah the prophet.

When crowds of people came out for baptism because it was the popular thing to do, John exploded: "Brood of snakes! What do you think you're doing slithering down here to the river? Do you think a little water on your snakeskins is going to deflect God's judgment? It's your life that must change, not your skin. And don't think you can pull rank by claiming Abraham as 'father.' Being a child of Abraham is neither here nor there—children of Abraham are a dime a dozen. God can make children from stones if he wants. What counts is your life. Is it green and flourishing? Because if it's deadwood, it goes on the fire."

The crowd asked him, "Then what are we supposed to do?" "If you have two coats, give one away," he said. "Do the same with your food." Tax men also came to be baptized and said, "Teacher, what should we do?" He told them, "No more extortion—collect only what is required by law." Soldiers asked him, "And what should we do?" He told them, "No harassment, no blackmail—and be content with your rations.
