Dear Friends,

From August 3-5, Rev. Sheri Edwards and Dawn Zepernick, both healing prayer ministers, Pastor Dwight and I, facilitated Christian Healing Ministries (CHM) School of Healing Prayer Level 1 at Parkview. The conference was three full days dedicated to the teaching of healing prayer through videos featuring CHM's founders, Francis and Judith MacNutt, and a class discussion format. We followed the CHM model with daily worship, prayer practicums, additional teaching and training on healing prayer from Rev. Dwight, and hands-on training in praying for others. I interviewed Rev. Dwight, Rev. Sheri, and Dawn to hear their impressions of the conference. What were their impressions of the class and the content? Did it go as they expected? Rev. Sheri said she was amazed at how receptive those who attended the healing prayer conference were to the teaching. And how responsive the Parkview class was to putting into practice what they learned in our video training sessions. Dawn expressed a similar idea. She was impressed by the openness the class had to learning and applying the healing prayer materials in the practicums. Dawn added, "I love Parkview Church and the people here. I'd move to Sacramento just to go to Parkview!" Rev. Dwight noted there was so much good God was doing in our time together. The reception of the new ideas was much better than I expected, he said. It was fun to see the prayer team in action on Friday when we prayed for each other. God guided it and blessed it and we'll see what God does with it next, he added. I add a hearty Amen to all they said. It was a joy and a delight to study together, to eat delicious food at meals together, to ask practical questions and receive Biblical teaching from Rev. Dwight on the wonder of miracles in Scripture and in

We didn't just get head knowledge. With God's help, we brought what we learned in the class sessions into real life prayer for each other. The honor and trust the prayer recipients bestowed on us all by being willing to let us pray for them was remarkable. We came to learn about healing prayer because we wanted to know how to pray more effectively for each other at church, for our friends and families, and for the world. We all sensed God's love and presence with us as we studied and prayed. What a gift to see and feel God's Spirit bringing us together in this shared experience.

Rev. Sheri summed up our exciting and meaningful experience of healing prayer when she preached about Jesus' healing miracles in her sermon at Parkview on August 7. She said, "We should never stop praying for miracles, even if we know we can't control the outcome of our prayers. The world needs miracles of unexpected goodness, and peace, and healing love now more than ever! And every time you hear about a miraculous answer to prayer, or you experience one, remember that you are getting a preview of God's Kingdom breaking through on earth, as it is in heaven." Thanks be to God! Amen!

Report from Session July 21, 2022 Meeting:

- The 2 CDs in Charles Schwab account are accruing interest.
- New Personnel Team approved: William Yee/Chair, Judy Fukuman, Lori Hart, Jonathan Sakakibara.
- ACC 50th Ohana Walk is Sep 17, 2022. Parkview team presently has 19 people, and more can sign up with \$35 donation. Parkview will have a table on the route to pass out information.
- Church credit card: Look into acquiring a Parkview Business Credit Card for certain staff to use, rather than using their own personal credit cards and getting reimbursement. Checking options from banks where we hold accounts.
- Dr. Oanh Meyer, UCD Neurologist, studies brain health with interest in Asian faith communities. She will give a short seminar after a service Sep 11 and connect interested people with the study.
- New Parking Signs: Considered replacing old faded signs in the lot behind the church with larger signs that mention towing away violators.
- Threat assessment: Team to meet in late August to update protocol, evacuation procedures, and active shooter plans.
- Building and Grounds- Security: Alarm system list needs 4 people and clear course of action to follow. Security cameras- upgrade system.

Clients will be connected with housing services, resources, as well as finding a few hours of hospitality. A request is made for Parkview to provide volunteers for the center and for donations. Camera Club Visits Wild Horses

In late June, three members of Parkview's Camera Club, Bill Nagata, Jonathan Sakakibara, and Maurine Huang, along with Maurine's husband Jerry, traveled to Gardnerville NV, just 16 miles south of Carson City. There, one can find several bands of wild horses, descendants of horses which escaped from Spanish explorers, 19th century pioneers, and others. Their guide was Cheryl Broumley, member of the Pine Nut Wild Horse Advocates (PNWHA).



PNWHA was formed in 2014 and is headquartered in Gardnerville. It watches carefully over the welfare of the horses, providing water far away from residential areas during dry months, and, importantly, working with the federal Bureau of Land Management (BLM) to administer fertility control.
