Dear Friends,

For me, Fall has always been a season made for musings and memories. Maybe it's the children returning to school, the shortened hours of daylight, or packing away the swimsuits and pulling out jackets that brings about my nostalgic feelings. As the sun slants golden through the changing leaves, and the morning air carries a hint of crispness, my mind is drawn backward as I reflect on Fall in years gone by. Is it the cooler evenings or the Canada geese flying in formation that evokes memories of my own school days? Marching with my high school band at Friday night football games, the autumn air mingled with the smell of wood smoke and concession popcorn.

I still remember the excitement of gathering on the hill outside my high school and crunching through fallen leaves to the football stadium. If I close my eyes, I can smell Colgate toothpaste, Love's Fresh Lemon cologne and Brut aftershave. And Juicy Fruit gum. Chewing gum was strictly forbidden for bandies, but the narrow pockets in our black uniform pants were just the right size for a couple silver foil wrappers of gum. Contraband in the brass section. I no longer hoist a mellophone to play the "Star Spangled Banner" under the stadium lights in the Fall. These days I know Fall is here when I wear ear muffs on my morning run. How do you mark the changing seasons, the passing of time? How do you make the most of the time you've been given? Psalm 90:12 is a prayer asking God for help to live wisely and well. "So teach us to number our days that we may return to You a heart of wisdom."

How do we live wisely as we navigate turbulent seasons like these? On the eve of the US mid-term elections in November, wisdom and peace are hard to find. How do we face the justifiable rage around racial injustice and the agonizing suffering of a global pandemic? In this season, discipleship requires deep listening and empathy, and courageous, persistent action to follow Jesus in the way of love, grace, and justice. The point isn't to go back in time or to make things 'normal' again. Yearning for the past may gloss over our need to engage real injustice and pain. We are to be those who "seek justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with our God" (Micah 6:8) in order to demonstrate life under God's reign. May God gift each of us with wisdom to know how to live authentically in these days. May we find true hope in Christ, trusting that in the midst of everything, God hears our sorrow and confusion, our anger and fear. We are all God's beloved children whose experiences and perspective enrich the world. This season and every

season of our lives, we are called to be caring members of God's family, touching the world with God's transformation and freedom. Here is a portion of a poem by Joy Harjo, the first Indigenous US Poet Laureate, that commends living with reverence and wisdom.



A provisional plan regarding the exit paths for evacuation during an emergency will be shared with the congregation, then reviewed, and revised. Invitation to World Communion Oct 2

Bread. It's known by different names all over the world. In India, they eat naan. South of the border, it's tortillas. Jewish folks celebrate Passover with unleavened matzo, and braided challah calls for gratitude for God's provision on Shabbat. In the Middle East, it's pita. Armenians eat cracker bread called lavash. Southerners are partial to their momma's biscuits. Folks out west sing the praises of sourdough. Whatever kind of bread we eat -a New York bagel with lox and cream cheese or tuna with light mayo on wheat bread, they all keep us going. But bread is not the source of life. Jesus is. Jesus is our bread for the journey. World Communion Sunday is always the first Sunday of October. It is a tradition that originated at the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933 and spread to other denominations. The sacrament invites us to focus on the gift of connection with God and each other. World Communion celebrates our unity in Christ with Christians around the world. No matter how we break it – slice it, cube and dice it, pour it or dip it or sip it - the bread and cup at the Lord's table somehow makes us one, one with each other, and one with Christ. Come to Christ's table at Parkview on Sunday, October 2, at 10 am, to receive bread for the journey. Come to His table, believing that God's healing love can restore wholeness and welcome us home. From our Lord's table, go out into the world to work for the healing and reconciliation of all creation.



2022 Annual Financial Review: Steve Hanway will review Presbytery guidelines and requirements and contact John Arthur, NCCP Treasurer to set up this annual audit.

Banner for ACC Ohana Walk: Motion approved to hang a PPC banner at Parkview table during the Ohana Walk. Donna Komure-Toyama presented a design for the banner. Titus Toyama will donate cost. **PPC Credit Card:** Betsy Eskridge obtained a credit card through Chase Bank.

South Sacramento Interfaith Partnership: Parkview has been approved as a new faith partner with SSIP. Carla Hart and Lois Van Beers will be board members. Parkview's 2022 donation to SSIP will be \$2,225, with subsequent annual donations being \$4,500 through NCCP mission giving.

Threat Assessment: Hach Yasumura, William Yee, and Lois Van Beers will decide what information needs to be disseminated to the congregation in an after church meeting.

Westminster Respite Center: The Respite Center has opened every Wednesday in the Westminster patio. Volunteers are requested to help from 8:30-11:30.
