#### Dear Friends,


When Titus announced in church that he was the organizer for Parkview's 2023 Team for My Sister's House Run for a Safe Haven, he mentioned that some Parkview participants walk the 5K event and others run it. He said some of the runners were slightly competitive. He didn't mention that he is by far the fastest member of the Parkview team. Last year Titus took 3rd place in his age group. That's impressive. He admits that he has a 'home court advantage' since he frequently runs at the park. Titus knows that the Nave family can be a tad competitive as well. Sports events, board games, you name it, we all go for the win. I didn't tell Titus that I had once raced a man in a motorized wheelchair in Virginia during a morning run. He let me win. I take any wins I can get on a Monday morning. Our neighbor Jeff, and his German Shepherd, Zoey, ride on the streets in our neighborhood so Zoey can get exercise. The first time I ran past Jeff and his service dog, Zoey barked and lunged at me. I froze. I pay close attention to big barking dogs with large teeth. Jeff apologized and told Zoey to mind her manners. The next time I saw them, Jeff stopped way up the street and sat with Zoey until I passed them. "Don't bark at Miss Sarah," he told Zoey. "Thanks, Jeff!" I said. "Hi, Zoey!" I said, and thought, "Thanks for not biting me!"

Seeing Jeff and his pal Zoey in the neighborhood reminded me of a wonderful documentary Dwight and I watched on PBS a while back, "Through a Dog's Eyes." It's the story of Jennifer Arnold, founder of Canine Assistants, who raises service dogs on her farm near Atlanta, Georgia. The show details the whole process from newborn puppy to well-trained service partner. Jennifer Arnold's inspiration for her remarkable career arose from a challenge in her own life. She was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis as a teenager. Her father helped Jennifer find a renewed sense of purpose with the idea of owning a service dog and training dogs for others in need. It took years, but that dream came true with Canine Assistants. Nowadays Arnold and her husband, a veterinarian, and their staff match

applicants for service dogs with what she calls dogs with special abilities for people with special needs. As with any relationship, communication seems to be the key. She said dogs want to please us, but they don't speak our language, so we have to help them behave in ways that work for us.

Watching dogs and humans interact in such mutually beneficial ways made me wonder if we are learning to understand God's language, the language of love and service, in our time on earth. Are we learning to obey God's commands? Is it our heart's desire to please God, and love God? Do we enjoy serving God and giving our best to God each day? God is so patient with us, so encouraging, and so loving. I hope we bring God even a fraction of the joy that those dogs bring their owners. Here's to being devoted and teachable and responsive to God's Spirit, guiding us as we learn God's language of love, so we can serve others well and bring joy to God's heart.

## News

#### Report from Session

At the September 14 meeting of Session, the following matters were voted upon and/or discussed:

 Donation for Maui Relief – As part of the Aloha offering drive in August, Parkview members donated \$3,240 for Maui relief



efforts. More research will be done, including any input from the Congregation, to determine an agency or agencies who will receive these funds;

- Visit from Teachers at William Land School on October 5, at 3:10 p.m., several teachers from nearby William Land School will visit Parkview as the church has been designated as a "safety place" for the school. Parkview will offer drinks and light refreshment for the teachers. In addition, Pastor Sarah will review records to determine any obligations that Parkview may have agreed to as a safe place;
- Resignation of Carla Hart from Session With much sadness and gratitude for her leadership, Session agreed to accept the resignation of Carla Hart. Election of Elders and other church officers will occur in January 2024;
- Budget for 2024 the Personnel Committee will be asked to recommend any salary adjustments for purposes of establishing a budget for the coming year;
- Youth Enrichment Session Jana Nakase-Lee reported that Sunday school will be held on the first and third Sunday of the month. Activities for the youth will include teaching compassion for the homeless and knitting scarves for donations as a community service project. Many thanks to Jana, Lois Van Beers, Julie Chew, and Lynn Yamamoto for donating their time to teach Sunday school;
- Safety and Security Grant Update Session agreed that new fencing to secure the church grounds is a priority. William Yee reported that Parkview will need to obtain a permit for the fencing to be built which will require approval of architectural plans. Lighting and camera installation are the other areas to be addressed;




