Dear Friends,

Desiring to build upon Parkview's core belief of equity and inclusion, a group gathered after worship on Sunday, April 14, in the social hall for a light lunch and a 2-hour interactive Diversity Equity Inclusion Belonging training with facilitator Europa Grace. Europa, or Ro, was an excellent presenter. They proved knowledgeable and affable, skillfully encouraging us to consider our biases as well as the personal power we have that can be used to implement change. The training, through an LGBTQ+ inclusion lens, defined key identities and terminology related to gender and sexuality, created a lively discussion. There was a lot to hear and consider in a condensed 2-hour training. The workshop I previously attended with Ro lasted six hours! Here are a few of my takeaways from Parkview's DEIB event that may suggest, "Church, let's talk about this!"

Bias is a general preference for or against people based on their group membership. There are implicit biases that are assessments and determinations that we make unconsciously, and explicit biases that are conscious. These explicit biases determine who gets access and opportunities. So, the question becomes who gets to decide "what's best for everyone?" These crucial decisions leave some in society well-cared for and others with a marginalized and disenfranchised experience.

Ro asked us to consider a **Conclusion Shift** to consider as we "size people up" when we greet them. What if we carried these assumptions into interactions with new people and those we already know?

1. This person is whole and complete.
2. This person has goals/dreams and a desire to make a difference.
3. This person has their own answers.
4. This person is contributing to me right now.
5. This person deserves to be treated with dignity and respect.

Pronouns are how we identify ourselves apart from our name. Using correct pronouns is a matter of respect. We spent a lot of time during the workshop talking about pronouns. Ro uses they/them pronouns, told us why, and explained that using the pronoun that someone requests takes practice. They gave us an acronym for when we make a mistake and use the wrong one: ACT= Apologize, Correct, Try again. New pronoun usage takes work. We learned certain things about pronouns in school; now we get to learn something new. Why bother? Because it's a way to say, "I care about you, who you are, and what matters to you." And, as Ro wisely noted, so that there are fewer people who feel they are harmed in church. Once we say to the LGBTQ+ community, "You're welcome here at Parkview," do people actually feel it when they get here? We sure hope so. Using their pronoun correctly is one way to extend the genuine hospitality we feel to others.

Ro also provided a **Social Location Wheel** with spokes like Education, Wealth, Race, and Gender Identity on it and asked us to place ourselves on the wheel. The closer to the center of the wheel, the more power and influence we have. Ro showed us that they are toward the outer side on many of the spokes and asked us to consider how much power we have in order to bring about change. We can use our voice and influence to direct the folks who walk alongside us in real life toward the life of someone who is living a more marginalized experience. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are called to love others by including them and caring about their lives. Recognizing our own biases and affinities, as well as the assumptions we make that exclude others, is important work for us to do as we seek to be proactively inclusive at Parkview. It's both inner work and community work, and I'm grateful to be on this journey of learning how to share God's loving care to all with you.

News

March Report from Session

At the March 14, 2024 meeting of Session, the following matters were reported, voted upon, and/or discussed:

- Confirmation of Email Votes Taken by Session in February:

1) confirmed use of Heiwa for approximately 2 weeks by unhoused person, Raymond Douglas, to store his belongings and to shelter during the hours of 6 pm to 9 am, while his scooter is being repaired (Update: Raymond returned key to Heiwa and expressed his gratitude for use of the Heiwa);

2) confirmed authorization of Pastor Sarah to enter into contract with Europa Grace who will facilitate a two hour interactive presentation to the congregation on April 14, from 12 - 2 pm about understanding and acceptance of the LGBTQ+ community;

3) confirmed that Parkview will support Wind Youth by paying \$150 in expenses for a Christmas party for the youth held in December;

- *Parkview's Mission Giving.* Session voted to approve donating a total of \$7,500 for 2024 through the Presbytery as follows: \$5,000 for the South Sacramento Interfaith Partnership (SSIP) food closet; and, \$2,500 to the Mosaics outreach program through the Davis Community Church. In addition, Session voted to donate \$2,500 for humanitarian aid for the people of Gaza. The Gaza donation will be donated directly to an established organization to be determined after research and continued discussion;
- *Repair of Plumbing in Kansha House.* Session voted to approve the repairs to the toilet and tub faucet in an amount up to \$1,500 by plumber Bryan Onodera;
- *Safety Security Grant Update.* Security lighting has now been installed and enhances the security of the church in the evening. Many thanks to William Yee and his team for overseeing this important project. We are still waiting for a bid for the replacement of wooden doors to the choir room with metal doors. Security cameras and fencing will be installed last. A permit may be required for the fencing which, in turn, will require construction plan drawings;
- *Fence Design Suggestion.* As previously reported, the wooden fencing around the church will soon be replaced by wrought iron. Stan Umeda, one of the original designers of the wooden fence, suggested



using some of the old wood to rebuild a portion of the 4-foot fence to be built around the front of the church. This suggestion will be the subject of further review and discussion;

- *Parkview's Historic Wooden Welcome Sign.* This historic sign has been beautifully refurbished by Stan Umeda. We will ask Stan to deliver the sign to Parkview to assist in determining an appropriate place for the sign to be hung.

April Report from Session

At the April 11, 2024 meeting of Session, the following matters were reported, voted upon, and/or discussed:

- *Donation for Gaza Humanitarian Relief.* Gary Younglove reported that there are several agencies providing humanitarian relief for the people of Gaza. He will continue researching this issue and will identify and bring to Session those agencies that are established, reputable, and can be recommended as possible donation recipients;
- *Draft Donation Letter for Summerfest 2024.* Session voted to approve a draft of a letter prepared by Donna Komure-Toyama, which will be sent to identified individuals and businesses who may be willing to purchase tickets to the Summerfest fundraiser or donate silent auction items;
- *Temporary Designation of Gender Neutral Restroom on April 14.* Session voted to designate the men's restroom as gender neutral on April 14 when, after service, justice facilitator and presenter Europa Grace (they, them) will be providing interactive training to Parkview members and friends about diversity and inclusivity as it relates to the LGBTQ+ plus community. Appropriate signage will be installed outside the men's restroom;
- *Sacramento Gay Pride Parade Participation.* Session voted to approve Parkview's participation in the Gay Pride Parade scheduled on June 9, after worship service, and to pay the entry fee up to \$200;

- *Parking Update.* Session voted to approve the rental of up to four spots behind the church during the weekdays and to erect an appropriate barrier securing all spots;
- *Summerfest 2024 Update.* The next planning meeting is scheduled for April 29. Teriyaki sauce will be made in the next couple of months on a date to be determined and will be sold at Summerfest. In addition, any remaining jars of teriyaki sauce made in 2022 will be sold at this fundraiser at a discount;
- *Spring Cleaning Day.* The Heiwa, garage, and basement of the Kansha house need to be cleared of items no longer needed. Clean up date will be scheduled soon;
- *Fence Design Proposal.* Stan Umeda, one of the original builders of the wooden fence surrounding the church, came to the Session meeting and explained how portions of the wooden fence around the church could be saved and reused to build a 4-foot fence around the front of the church. Stan volunteered to be the Project Manager and will oversee the construction of this portion of the fence. Session thanks Stan for designing and constructing the existing fence and for his willingness to help construct a portion of the new fence to be built;
- *Parkview's Historic Wooden Sign.* This historic sign has been beautifully refurbished by Stan Umeda. Stan delivered the sign to Parkview and an appropriate place for the sign to be hung is being considered;
- *Safety Security Grant Update.* The current position of the City of Sacramento is that an approved permit is required to build the wrought iron fence around the church. Updates to follow;
- *Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Teams.* Roger Lee is seeking volunteers to serve. Terri Bowman and Jana Nakase-Lee expressed interest;
- *Name Change.* Gary Younglove raised the question of whether or not Parkview might consider changing its name as so many churches have done recently in order to attract more attendees. Further discussion will occur;
