News

May Report from Session

At the May 9, 2024 meeting of Session, the following matters were reported, voted upon, and/or discussed:



- Donation for Gaza Humanitarian Relief – As part of the mission giving program, Session voted to donate \$1,250 to the World Central Kitchen and \$1,250 to Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. (Previously, Session voted to donate to the South Sacramento Interfaith Partnership food closet and to the Davis Community Church Mosaics outreach program). Many thanks to Gary Younglove for researching and identifying the numerous organizations providing humanitarian relief in Gaza;
- Donation for Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine Session decided once again to make an offering toward humanitarian aid to Ukraine instead of purchasing flowers and/or other celebratory items for Mother's Day or Father's Day;
- Wrought Iron or Wood Fencing After discussion about the pros and cons and aesthetics of using only wrought iron to construct a fence around the entire church, Session voted in a 3-3 tie for and against the use of this material alone. Further review and discussion will occur after input from William Yee and the Safety and Security Committee;
- Placement of Parkview's Historic Wooden Sign Session determined that an appropriate place to hang the refurbished sign will be in the narthex, in place of the scroll;
- Use of Kansha House by former pastoral resident Rola Al Ashkar from June to December 2024 – Session previously voted to approve the use of the Kansha by Rev. Rola, who no longer preaches at Westminster Church. Session approved by consensus that Rola will be permitted to reside in the Kansha without the payment of rent or utilities. We will ask Rola to help with certain errands such as watering plants in the half barrels placed in front of the church and taking the garbage cans out each week. After further research, the kitchen light in the Kansha may be upgraded and an alarm may be installed as well;
- Pathway to Healing Pastor Sarah announced that on June 26-27, the healing prayer team will offer prayer appointments for individual members of the congregation and friends and family;

- Parking Lot Update Parkview Mariners have offered to donate \$1,000 toward the cost of parking barriers to secure the spots behind the church. Session recommends that an initial step should be the use of plastic, temporary barriers, no parking signs, and a letter to the Catholic Church next door;
- Safety Security Grant Update William Yee reported that 2 doors (exit ramp door and choir room door) will soon be replaced;
- Summerfest 2024 Update silent auction items are still needed. Session voted against publicizing the event with the Sacramento Interfaith Council of Greater Sacramento;
- Gay Pride Parade June 9. Donna Komure-Toyama will teach parade participants the Ichi Tasu Ichi dance;
- Music Circus August 28;
- Aid to the Homeless Pastor Sarah announced that UCLA student Hailing Tang will submit a written proposal about a possible fundraiser to raise funds to purchase clothing for the homeless. Hailing is the daughter of Jun Tang who has assisted Parkview with several repairs, including cleaning and repair of light fixtures in the social hall.



A New Benefit Concert for Ukraine.

Please join us on July 7 at 11:30 am for this special concert by Igor Veligan and Natsuko Fukasawa. All proceeds will go to help children in Ukraine who lost fathers to the war. It is an occasion to gather our warm hearts to support people in Ukraine



who are in continuing difficulties. Pastor Igor is in Ternopil, working with the victims of the war including widows, their children, and those who need rehabilitation programs. There are frequent funerals. They do not have electricity for 9-12 hours a day. There are air strike alarms 3-4 times a day. The economy is falling sharply. Children are stressed and withdrawn, but Pastor Igor is in prayers to bring hope to their lives. He is helping 150 children and young adults in his summer camps. (See attached flyer.)

I suffered all the typical symptoms during my trip to Germany: fatigue, heart palpitations, high resting heart rate, unexplained weight loss. I ask for your patience as I slowly get back up to speed. It takes a while for the medication to even out my thyroid levels. Please take care of yourselves and make sure to have your thyroid levels (TSH, T3, T4) checked regularly.
