Dear Friends,

'Game On!' That's the text Dwight and I send our daughters, Chelsea and Han-Bee, in Portland when autumn begins. This year, autumn arrives on Sunday, September 22. For the Naves, 'Game On', means that leaf-catching season has officially begun. For years, our family members have competed to see who will be the first to catch a fall leaf mid-flight. Dwight and I have been known to stand under the maple trees in our front yard in Virginia on a windy fall day to try for our winning leaf, but it's a lot harder than it sounds. The leaves swirl down just out of reach, or you grab for one and miss it by a millisecond.

Hand-eye coordination has never been my thing, so after ten minutes of near misses in the front yard, I'd usually vow to catch my leaf on a morning run instead. Snagging a leaf from mid-air while running requires accurately judging time and distance as the leaves swirl down from the trees ahead. Lunging at the right moment to catch one without face-planting in a hole you didn't see while looking up at the falling leaves is the key.

And that is what made one year's win all the more memorable. I was walking down our driveway to the mailbox on the first day of our competition and saw a leaf slowly fluttering down. I stuck my hand out and it fell right in it. 'Game On!' 'Game Over!' Which is exactly what I texted Chelsea when I got back inside. She texted back, 'Nooooooo!' Then she mentioned that leaves in Portland hadn't changed color or started falling from trees yet. ''Is that so?'' I texted, not willing to revoke my historic win. Chelsea was gracious in defeat and vowed to redouble her leaf-catching efforts to beat Dwight and Han-Bee for second place.

Our Nave family traditions bring joy and fun and often, a little friendly competition, into our lives. I'm not sure when the leaf-catching contest started, but I'm glad it's still happening from coast to coast. I do know when we started visiting local pumpkin patches to choose a pumpkin each October. It was when I was pregnant with Chelsea, who was due to arrive in December. As I clambered onto the hay wagon bound for the fields, Dwight made a joke about the 'Great Pumpkin.' I knew he wasn't referring to orange gourds. He received cosmic payback over the years as Chelsea always chose the heaviest pumpkins, from the farthest corner of the field, as her personal favorites, for Dwight to carry back and hoist onto the hay wagon. Our traditions as a church family also bring joy and fun and help us mark significant times in our lives as a community. When we celebrate Aloha Sundays in August with Aloha shirts and leis, and have amazing food and frozen treats during Aloha coffee hour, we connect with Parkview's past when the church wasn't air-conditioned, and people wore light, comfy clothes to keep cool. When we gather at a memorial service to give witness to Christ's resurrection and honor a beloved church member's life, we share happy memories as well as heartache. Our many traditions unite us as a church family as we celebrate life's special moments together. So, perhaps, standing in the yard gazing up at the sky, seeing the golden slant of autumn sun on fluttering leaves while gauging where to be positioned to catch a falling leaf, might be one way of reclaiming the sacredness of the seasons of life.

No doubt you and your family have your own ways of celebrating special moments, or marking the Godmoments in your lives. Through a shared meal, some friendly competition, watching the sunset, saying good-bye to a beloved pet, or giving the gift of uninterrupted attention.

May our love for God continue to grow through all the seasons as we remember "the dream of Eden that shimmers at the edges of things," as author Douglas McKelvey writes in his book, *Every Moment Holy*. As we "remember that work and play and suffering and celebration are all sentences in a good story being told by God, a story arcing its way to a new creation." Amen!

# News

#### August Report from Session

At the August 8, 2024 meeting of Session, the following matters were reported, voted upon, and/or discussed:



- Update on Unhoused Couple Camping on Parking Lot Behind Church. Private property signs were recently posted, and Pastor Sarah spoke to the couple letting them know that they can no longer sleep in the parking lot. The police department will be asked to patrol the area behind the church in the evenings to discourage camping. Pastor may also call 311 for city assistance and/or Hope Cooperative for possible housing options for the couple.
- Safety and Security Grant Update. William Yee reported that the outdoor lighting and installation of the security doors have been completed. The security doors will be rekeyed and alarmed. The City has yet to issue a permit for the construction of the fence citing further changes that the City planning department claims are necessary. Parkview continues to work with the City to resolve these issues. The fence project was first reviewed by the City's planning department in September 2023.
- Welcome Letter. Visitors who attend Parkview may be interested in information about the history, programs, and goals of the church. We will work on a letter that will address these subjects and be available at the church front door whenever new visitors attend.
- 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday Sabbath. Beginning in 2025, in any month where a 5<sup>th</sup> Sunday occurs (3/30, 6/29, 8/31, 11/30), service will not be conducted at Parkview. Instead, church members are encouraged to spend time with family, take a nature walk, or attend worship service in other churches with the goal of establishing connections with churches in the surrounding community.
- Summerfest Wrap-Up. Treasurer Betsy Eskridge reported that the July financial report shows the net income from Summerfest is \$14,393. Thank you to everyone who made this fundraiser a success!

• Mariners Fundraiser for the Unhoused. On September 21, the Mariners will host a movie event fundraiser for the homeless. This fundraiser is a joint effort between the Mariners and Hailing Tang, who attends UCLA and attends church at Parkview with her parents.
