Dear Friends,

The season of Lent, the forty days before Easter, excluding Sundays, is the most important time of the year to nurture our inner life. So says Henri Nouwen in his Lenten devotional, *Called to Life, Called to Love.* Lent is the time in which we not only prepare ourselves to celebrate the mystery of the death and resurrection of Jesus, but also the death and resurrection that constantly takes place within us. Life is a continuing process of the death of the old and the familiar, and being born again into a new hope, a new trust and a new love.

Why is this process needed? So that we can consent to God's presence and action within us—that's the way Father Thomas Keating says it in his guides to Centering Prayer. God doesn't bully us, or push us along on our spiritual journey. If we want to meander, we meander. If we want to backtrack, we backtrack. If we want to veer off the path and spend time messing about, God allows us to do that, too. But we are always invited to grow closer to God. Deepening our relationship with God requires our consent—our consent to God's presence and action within us. And the season of Lent is a great time to develop our consent muscles in two ways: by Showing Up and by Hoping Up.

As I talk to people who are seeking to deepen their relationship with God, I notice they often mention the importance of just Showing Up: Showing Up to practice prayer or Bible study or worship, or whatever it is they're doing to get to know God better; by creating space for God in their lives, and developing their ability to listen to know, trust, and serve God. The season of Lent is an invitation to re-discover again, or discover for the first time, what God is like, and how to relate to God.

Connecting with God through faith means that we re-evaluate the preconceived ideas and hand-me-down values that we carry. To see what we still believe about God, and what we don't. Maybe it's time to grow into less restrictive views of what God can and cannot do: to seek to follow God, instead of always trying to lead the way, always telling God what to do. Lent is an ideal time to focus on that. And on Hope.

In his Message for Lent 2025, Pope Francis invites Christians to "journey together in hope" and to take the opportunity of the upcoming Lenten Season to ask ourselves whether we're willing to follow God's call to change our lives. One way to change our lives this holy season is to deliberately focus on hopeful things around us, instead of focusing on all the turmoil and chaos. Parkview's Worship Team ordered Lenten bracelets to help us all focus on hope. This year Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, on March 5. We invite everyone to pick up a Resilient Hope bracelet on Sunday March 2 at worship, and begin wearing it on Ash Wednesday. Each day, look and listen for signs of hope. When you notice hope, move your bracelet to your other wrist, and keep looking for hope. Each time you notice something hopeful, move your bracelet again.

We'll share in church about how looking for hope changes us and our outlook on the world. Showing up. Hoping up. Both are ways this Lenten season to give consent to God's presence and action within us, as we move through the world with resilient hope and love. Together.

The Session did not meet in February; instead it gathered for its annual retreat. The next report will appear in the April issue of the *Chapel Chimes*.




Ordination and Installation of Elders
