Dear Friends,

In a June 2 video opinion piece for the Washington Post, author Anne Lamott speaks about how to "keep the faith" during the current administration. I find Lamott's lived-in wisdom insightful and encouraging. So, in case your resilient hope needs a boost, I copied down what Lamott tells videographer Shih-Wei Chou, to share with you. Offering her advice for the Trump years, Lamott notes, "In the dark night of the soul, we don't flounder around and cry and scream and put on our reality shows. We sit there and we breathe." I do believe we're mobilizing now, internally for a great public demonstration as acts of resistance to the insanity and the cruelty and the illegality of what we see happening in D.C. While I am planning my part in the resistance, I'm spending a lot of time in quiet. I'm spending a lot of time breathing. I'm spending a lot of time trying to help other people who feel way more scared or furious. Just today, I sent off donations to Oxfam, the ACLU and Planned Parenthood. And I'm headed out to take food to the food pantry.

The only thing that's ever changed the world before are these movements of nonviolent protest, of love, and of rising up against the <u>Bull Connors</u> and the fire hoses and the dogs on the civil rights marchers. And it will work again. We just never give up. We keep the faith. We keep the faith in goodness. We keep the faith in nonviolent protest. One thing that is very important to me right now, in terms of me and my role in the resistance, is remembering what Dr. King said, which was, "Don't let them get you to hate them."

May God's love and desire for justice and wholeness for humanity and all creation inspire and empower us to keep the faith, and to do whatever we can to bring God's light into our world. Keep the faith. Omid Safi says it this way, "Just because ego and greed and hatred are doing cosplay as religion, I don't want us to give it that much credit. I want us to insist that no, there is real religion! There's real faith, and it's humble and it carries the scent of love and concern, not just for our own kind, but for all of us." Amen!


